As a student ministry, we want to do everything in our power to help steer the hearts and minds of teenagers toward submission to their parents. In the cases where a parent figure is missing in their life, we will do our best to serve as a father to the fatherless (Psalm 68:5).



significant relationships with godly adults

Reggie Joiner said, “Every son or daughter needs other adult voices in their lives who will say things a Christian parent would say.” Many strong adult Christians have had some person in their life, other than their parents, who cared for them and helped them grow in their walk with Christ.
